

*Peacebuilders Initiative offers a unique opportunity to live closely with friends from many different walks of life and backgrounds. Together we form a single body, connected through our participation in Jesus' ministry. With our collective energy of mature exploration of our Catholic Christian faith, it is possible for us to support each other on the path toward mutual transformation. This requires respect, cooperation, and appreciation for each other's differences. It is our goal that every Peacebuilder be a witness of Jesus' love, and it is with this in mind that we ask each participant to commit to the following Code of Conduct.*

**Please note: Any infraction of the rules may result in the participant's parents/guardian and their partner contact being notified to bring their son/daughter/participant home immediately. Please read through this form carefully. Completion of this agreement is mandatory for attendance.**

1. Youth participants may not use or possess alcoholic beverages and/or any other illegal drug or substance including tobacco. Participants may not use or possess any type of weapon or instrument that could be used as a weapon.
2. Participants are required to follow the schedule and participate in programs and activities unless exempted for medical reasons. When engaged in activities off campus, participants are required to be in the presence of a Peacebuilders staff member or mentor at all times, unless otherwise instructed by a staff member or mentor.
3. Participants and their parents/guardians are responsible for any damages they cause. This includes graffiti and/or the physical damage to facilities and property of others.
4. Participants may not tamper with smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, fire alarms or any other emergency equipment. Tampering with such items is considered a misdemeanor and is punishable by law.
5. Participants are not permitted to be in the dorm rooms of persons of the opposite sex at any time.
6. Inappropriate sexual contact and expression is not allowed.
7. Dress code policy must be followed at all times (see the Peacebuilders Handbook for details).
8. Mobile devices, video games, laptop computers, MP3 players, and other related electronic devices are not permitted. When such items are brought to Peacebuilders, the staff will collect and return them at the end of the program week.
9. In the case of emergency, parents/guardians may contact their children by calling the cell phones of the Director and Associate Director. Andy and/or Kyle will find the participant as soon as possible.
10. Participants agree to abide by all rules established by the Director, Peacebuilders Staff and Mentors and those stated in the Peacebuilders Handbook mailed to participants.
11. Harassment in any form will not be tolerated.
12. Participants agree to respect the role of adult leaders in promoting and administering the above rules and regulations and those stated in the Peacebuilders Handbook.
